INFORMATION REGARDING Australian Bat Lyssavirus:

- If a member of the public has handled a bat, and been bitten or scratched, (referred to as a Category 3 or C3 bat) then this person must have a course of rabies vaccinations. Obtain contact details of person who was bitten or scratched. Please inform the Qld Health Dept. so they can organise the vaccinations. & Bat Rescue coordinator. If it has died then **DO NOT** put the animal in your freezer, put it in a plastic bag into refrigeration.
- When handling a flying-fox enquiry on the hotline, advise the person **DO NOT HANDLE THE ANIMAL UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCE**. If it is in a public place, then ask them to stand by and ensure that no one approaches the animal. Again this minimises the risk of destroying an animal that may **not be infected**.
- Insectivorous bats are to be treated the same as Flying Foxes.
- Please complete the call log on the online records system.
- Any bat that is sick and dies of unknown causes may have Lyssavirus. Refrigerate as it may be required for testing.

First Aid if bitten or scratched

- Wash wound carefully with soap and water for approximately 5 minutes.
- If you have been vaccinated before, then depending on whether the result is positive, further vaccinations are required (two injections at day 0 and day 3).
- If you have not been vaccinated, then it may be necessary to start the post-exposure prophylaxis prior to the results becoming available. Ask your GP or contact the Public Health Unit on 5409 6607

INFORMATION REGARDING Australian Bat Lyssavirus:

- If a member of the public has handled a bat, and been bitten or scratched, (referred to as a Category 3 or C3 bat) then this person must have a course of rabies vaccinations. Obtain contact details of person who was bitten or scratched. Please inform the Qld Health Dept. so they can organise the vaccinations. & Bat Rescue coordinator. If it has died then **DO NOT** put the animal in your freezer, put it in a plastic bag into refrigeration.
- When handling a flying-fox enquiry on the hotline, advise the person **DO NOT HANDLE THE ANIMAL UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCE**. If it is in a public place, then ask them to stand by and ensure that no one approaches the animal. Again this minimises the risk of destroying an animal that may **not** be infected.
- Insectivorous bats are to be treated the same as Flying Foxes.
- Please complete the call log on the online records system.
- Any bat that is sick and dies of unknown causes may have Lyssavirus. Refrigerate as it may be required for testing.

First Aid if bitten or scratched
